Shared use of Public Lands

We are blessed to live in a state and a region of the state that has an abundance of public lands for multiple uses – natural resource production, recreation, and habitat preservation can all be accommodated. Usually, tension arises when these different uses come in contact with each other in the same area or at the same time of the season.

What I would like to address here is when the various user groups have contact within the same land use category, specifically those using the land for recreation. The groups using the public lands during the winter in Northwest Montana include snowmobiles, back country skiers, cross country skiers, fat tire bikers, dog sledders, snows hoers, ice fishermen and trappers. In order for us to maintain access and have a good and safe experience in the back country and on maintained trails, we need to all work together and be courteous to one another when we meet and utilize our public lands.

Specially, when we are out on the FSA groomed trail system, there are others that have access to our trails and we need to be mindful that it's their land to use as well. When we meet a grooming machine, whether it's ours or someone else's, we need to give way as best we can and get around them and continue on down the trail. Skiers are more abundant on the trail as Whitefish Mountain Resort has opened more areas to back country access. Slow down when approaching skiers and give them a wide berth. Your 500 pound machine is nimble and responsive, but skiers can be unpredictable. Sled dogs can be startled by our loud machines. Pull over, turn off your machine, and let them pass before continuing. Also, if you're in an area that is frequently used by another group, please be aware of your trenching and try and leave a track that will not disrupt the use of the area by others.

The FSA is continually working with other groups and state and federal agencies to maintain and improve the snowmobile experience in our short snowmobile season. We ask all users to be safe and courteous to one another while they are using the access we have to the public lands. If you experience a conflict with someone while out on the snow, please let us know about it. Document with photos, times, and locations if at all possible and we will report it to the proper authorities. We at the FSA are committed to helping the snowmobile community any way we can, whether it is on our trail system or not. We are also working with other groups on ways to minimize conflicts in the areas where our various uses may come into contact with each other.

We at the FSA believe that, if we work together, we can continue to have a safe and enjoyable public land's experience for many years to come.

As we reported last month, membership to the FSA is on the rise--and THANK YOU! We also have over 900 people liking our Facebook Page and over 350,000 hits per year on our website! However, actual club memberships are now right at 100 memberships with nearly 200 persons represented (family memberships count for multiples). What we are noticing is that there is a wide difference between people liking our Facebook page and paid members--700+.

These members who have come from other areas of the country informed us that grooming info is something most are willing to pay for...so why give it away? This is why we want you to come to meetings! You (our members) have good ideas!!!! Our board agrees. It's time to give paid members more for their membership and hopefully attract a few more people to the club.

So our board faces a decision and we're going to try out some different ways of getting grooming reports out to those that want them. We are going to stop posting grooming reports on Facebook. We will tell people our normal grooming schedule, but actual grooming reports and groomer track info will be hidden from our website.

We'd like your thoughts on this. We're going to try it out and if it doesn't work, we'll make adjustments--nothing is in stone, but our current line of thinking is that if the grooming report is important enough, a membership should also be a priority to you.

It's a great exercise and if you've never used your beacons before, ask a club member, or check out one of the classes offered by the <u>Friends of the Flathead Avalanche</u> Center.

It doesn't take that long to get proficient with the beacons, but there are things about them you need to know which could help you if the worst ever happened. Everyone likes to think that "I just stay out of those areas", but you never know when you might be called on to help someone and knowing how to use that little box could save a life. Just ask yourself how you'd feel if you rode up to an avalanche site saw something sticking out of the debris and didn't know how to use your beacon.

After all that exercise (both mental and physical!), we figured it was time for food, so we rode back down, fired up the grill, got the hot cocoa poured, chips, snacks and candy open AND had a great lunch!



If you can help, we would greatly appreciate it!






Trail Maintenance

FSA Scholarship - Call for Entries (Deadline April 1)

If you are a club member and you have children in High School about to graduate and go to Tech School or College, you may want to apply for the FSA Scholarship! Your child may receive a \$250 scholarship for their continued education. You might be a college student that is currently a member or a child covered under a family membership.

To apply <u>click here</u> to get the application form. Applications must be received by April 1, 2019 and payments will be made upon successful completion of the next semester. Payments are made on the following semester of award GPA (we don't look at cumulative GPA, only the semester the award is made in):

- •A to B Average (3.0 or better): 100% of the Award (\$250)
- •B to C Average (2.0 2.99): 50% of the Award (\$125)
- •Below 2.0 Average: No Award

All three trail systems the FSA maintains (Canyon Creek, Crane Mountain, and Desert Mountain) will be available for free download to club members. The Trail Treker app is \$2 (one time). The app is available on the Apple and Google stores. The app will show you exactly where you are at all times (with no mobile phone coverage needed!). You will need this code: **FSA18** to download the maps. Just another great benefit coming from your FSA dues!

Trail Treker is a locally owned company doing business with clubs across the country. We have partnered with them to make sure you have the safest and most enjoyable ride possible. Using Trail Treker, the FSA also makes money by showing local businesses on the map as well as from visitors to the area downloading the map! So make sure you tell everyone and especially visitors, to download the app and maps!


