FSA Brushing Tractor

In 2017, the FSA applied for and received a RAC grant through the Forest Service for the purpose of trail brushing. Upon receipt of the news that we were awarded the grant, we asked that instead of paying a contractor to brush 23 miles of trail ONCE, could we instead purchase a piece of equipment to brush with any time we wish?! The Forest Service said that would be fine, so that's what we did. What we found and ultimately purchased was a Ford / New Holland 7740, four wheel drive tractor with a Tiger articulated brush arm and heavy duty brushing head. It is rated to cut up to 5" diameter brush! After some repairs, we were going to take it out on November 10th and 11th, but as Rick was getting it warmed up to load on the trailer to take it to Porcupine Creek, it blew a power steering hose. So we are going to get it fixed and see if we can still get it out this year. Otherwise we will be all ready come next spring. We will keep you posted.

What Did the FSA Accomplish Last Year??

We understand you have a busy life and can't keep up with everything that goes on, but your dedicated board does a ton of work (and not just in the winter!) to keep things moving forward!

Here's a rundown of what the dedicated volunteers did this past year:

- ⇒ Applied for and were awarded \$45,000 RTP Grant
- ⇒ Applied for and were awarded \$21,000 State Grant
- ⇒ Attended multiple meetings with the USFA, DNRC, MSA, and other organizations
- ⇒ Hired three groomer operators and one plow truck driver for the past winter
- ⇒ Hired a contract groomer to groom Desert Mtn and Crane/Porcupine Mtn trails
- ⇒ Performed over 2,000 hours of maintenance work on our groomers & equipment
- ⇒ Moved all our equipment from N. Kalispell storage barn to a new location
- ⇒ Held the Pray for Snow Party and raised money for the club
- \Rightarrow Took the special folks that work at Flathead Industries for a snowmobile ride
- ⇒ Held a family day ride and picnic
- ⇒ Marched/drove in the Night of Lights Parade in Columbia Falls
- ⇒ Canvassed the valley businesses for support/sponsorship
- ⇒ Hosted and guided the Trans-Montana Riders in January up on Stryker Peak
- ⇒ Were on SnowTrails TV showing off an epic powder day (video on website homepage)
- ⇒ Purchased a brushing tractor for the club to brush trails

We hope to see you at the meetings and our Pray for Snow Party--remember, attendance is important in many ways. And if you can, please volunteer to help out with our events--we could use a little help from time to time.





What Does Your Membership Mean??

Your membership means more than the dollars to us too. Every year, we apply for a state and federal grant which keeps the groomers running. Without your support and membership, we can't claim as many members or "users" of our trails and it's harder to justify our grant dollars to the folks that review the grant applications--so THANK YOU!

We are also trying to hold most (not all) of our meetings at Scotty's Bar or possibly other locations so we can have food and beverages...our first meeting in October was very well attended (Thank you all!)!

Finally, <u>please come to our events!</u> We are trying very hard to make this club into something that you want to be a part of. We are always looking for suggestions on event ideas and things to do--so chime in, get your voice heard and come and have some fun with us!

We also want to make sure you got your membership card--if you didn't, please call Mark Smolen at 406-407-0301 (and we'll get you one). Our membership term covers the winter season that bridges between two years and follows our fiscal year June 1 to May 31, and your card gets you a \$15 discount at Penco, Lelands, and Fastoys! So if you signed up in January, that was for last year and we're now in the 2018-2019 membership year.

We try very hard to keep our website current and we have a "Join the FSA" page that allows you to "subscribe" for your membership dues. Once you sign up, PayPal will charge your credit card once a year for your membership dues and you never have to fill out a form or remember to sign up again! Just keep your credit card current with PayPal and you're good to go! And it really helps us by not having to process checks or cash--so thanks to all that have used it! If you just want to try us out, you can do a one-time payment without the subscription.

Emery Creek Trail Brushing

During the month of September, the Flathead National Forest, in order to celebrate public access trails, worked with some of its partners to invite the public to participate in some trail maintenance project. On September 7th and 8th, the Flathead Snowmobile Association worked with members of the National Forest to work on brushing the back loop of the Desert Mountain Trail on the Emery Creek drainage. We had 8 people on Saturday and 4 on Sunday. As we were behind a road closure, the brushing could only be done with hand held saws and brush cutters. Even so, we got around three miles cut back to make grooming and riding easier and more enjoyable. Thank you everyone for your help and we look forward to doing it again next year!



Get the trail maps on your phone!



All three trail systems the FSA maintains (Canyon Creek, Crane Mountain, and Desert Mountain) will be available for free download to club members. The Trail Treker app is \$2 (one time). The app is available on the Apple and Google stores. The app will show you exactly where you are at all times (with no mobile phone coverage needed!). You will need this code: **FSA18** to download the maps. Just another great benefit coming from your FSA dues!

Trail Treker is a locally owned company doing business with clubs across the country. We have partnered with them to make sure you have the safest and most enjoyable ride possible. Using Trail Treker, the FSA also makes money by showing local businesses on the map as well as from visitors to the area downloading the map! So make sure you tell everyone and especially visitors, to download the app and maps!
